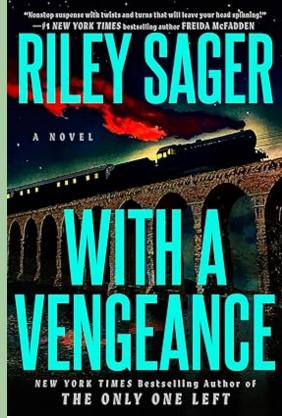

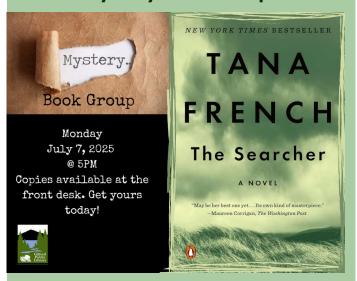

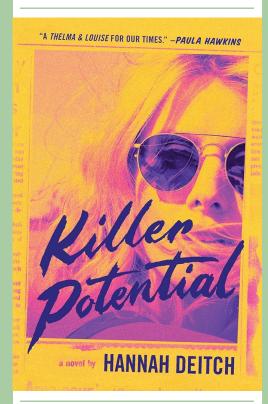

Nature Corner: A Look At Lupines - Part 2 by Wendy Oellers-Fulmer

The beloved children's book, Miss Rumphius by Barbara Cooney, was written in 1982 and told the story of an old woman who, after traveling the world, devoted her time to making the world more beautiful by spreading lupine seeds wherever she went. In the story, she became known as the "Lupine Lady".

In real life, there is an original "Lupine Lady" which



inspired the character and story of Miss Rumphius; Hilda Hamlin. Hilda was an immigrant from England, and like the main character in the story, had a cottage by the sea and actually sowed the blue-purple flowers all over coastal Maine. Hilda, also was a world traveler, with many adventures including

connections with famous artists and writers of her time. Her story has been documented through years of research by her granddaughter, Jennifer Hamlin Church, through dozens of diaries and over a thousand letters.
